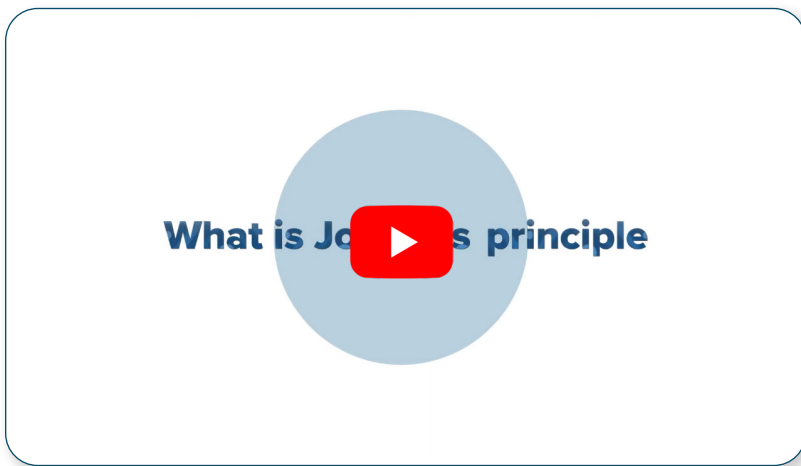


What is Jordan's Principle?

[Jordan's Principle](#) is a special funding source for First Nation's children. It is a child-first principle, named in the memory of Jordan River Anderson, a young child with complex health needs from the Norway House Cree Nation in Manitoba.

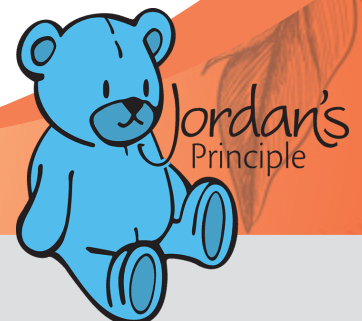

Jordan's Principle can pay for a wide range of health, social, and educational needs. Some examples include:

- Speech and Occupational Therapy
- Specialized Equipment
- Tutors or Indigenous Counsellors
- Assessments such as Psycho-Educational, a requirement for an Autism diagnoses
- Respite Care so parents can get a break
- Traditional Healing Services
